On November 9, 2022, at approximately 1700 hours, the Clayton County Police Department was dispatched to a “Person Stabbed” call in the area of South Main Street and Bill Casey Pkwy. A male subject had stabbed his wife/girlfriend somewhere on South Main Street. This location is across Tara Blvd and Old Poston Rd in relation to the Courthouse.

Investigators Steve Maddox and Jennifer Langley both heard the radio traffic as they were leaving the courthouse to go home, and both responded to the area to assist. Investigator Langley was on South Main Street near Noah’s Arc Rd when she heard the radio traffic advising that the victim was in the driveway of 9264 Deer Crossing Dr. While responding CCPD officers tried to find the offender, Investigator Langley went to the aid of the victim. She was the first Law Enforcement officer on scene and immediately began to render aid until back up arrived.

Investigator Maddox was turning onto Tara Blvd as he heard radio traffic from CCPD officers who were chasing the offender on foot around Old Poston Rd and Tara Blvd. He could see officers on foot running north bound along the south bound lanes of Tara Blvd chasing the offender. The offender was well ahead of the pursuing officers, with Investigator Maddox as the only Law Enforcement officer in front of his path. Investigator Maddox took immediate action to cut off the offender’s flight using his vehicle. He was able to pull in front of the offender to block his path and allow the pursuing officers to catch up. Investigator Maddox assisted the CCPD officers with taking the offender into custody.

Chief Investigator Brian Busch stated, “The actions taken by these Investigators are a credit to their dedication and professionalism as Law Enforcement Officers and District Attorney employees. I am extremely proud of them and consider it a great honor to serve with such dedicated public servants.” Clayton County Chief of Police Kevin Roberts is appreciative of the assistance provided. He stated, “On numerous occasions Clayton County Public Safety has successfully apprehended offenders through partnership and collaboration. The Clayton County Police Department appreciates the support that District Attorney’s Office investigators provided with the recent arrest of an offender for Aggravated Assault. Clayton County is safer when all Public Safety works together.”

Clayton County District Attorney Tasha Mosley echoes the sentiments of the Chief Busch and Chief Roberts. “I am honored to work with a team that always operates in the best interest of our citizens.
