Clayton County District Attorney Tasha M. Mosley announces the conviction of Rondriecko Nash. On September 28, 2022, a 12-person Clayton County jury found Nash guilty of Malice Murder, Felony Murder, Aggravated Assault, and Possession of Firearm by a Convicted Felon.

During the trial, the State presented evidence showing the Defendant and the victim met at a mutual friend's home on May 11, 2020. The Defendant became enraged and discharged a 9mm handgun 25 times at the victim while she sat in her car unarmed. The victim died from internal bleeding sustained from the gunshot wounds and was declared deceased at the hospital that afternoon.

This case was prosecuted by the Clayton County District Attorney Office's Special Victims Unit led by Deputy Chief Assistant District Attorney Rebecca Perez-Espejo. Assistant District Attorney Nigel Hunter was the secondary prosecutor. Investigator Jennifer Langley and Victim Advocate Alona Johnson also played a crucial role in the prosecution of the case. The trial began on September 26, 2022 and the guilty verdict was returned on September 28, 2022. Clayton County Superior Court Judge Jewel Scott presided over this case. A sentencing hearing is scheduled for October 7, 2022.

District Attorney Mosley stated, *"Another violent offender and another gun are off our streets! As always, my office continues to work tirelessly on behalf of all Clayton County citizens."*
